June 7 - 13, 2023

Rayong Province, Thailand

Article 1 General Rules

1.1 The 42nd Asian Road Cycling Championships, the 29th Asian Junior Road Cycling Championships and the 11th Asian Para-cycling Road Championships 2023 are owned by the Asian Cycling Federation (ACC), which has authorized the Thai Cycling Association (TCA), under the Royal Patronage of His Majesty the King, to organize competitions in Rayong, Thailand during June 7-13, 2023.

1.2 The Championships shall be organized in accordance with the rules and regulations of the Union Cycliste Intenationale (UCI) and these rules and regulations shall be in force for everything that is not mentioned in this document.

1.3 The 2023 Asian Road Cycling Championships, consisting of Time Trials and Road Races, are scheduled from June 7-13, 2023. The Championships may be competed with riders participating by the National Federations / Associations as the National Team.

Article 2 Type of the Event

2.1 The event is opened to riders of Women Junior (WJ) / Men Junior (MJ) / Women Under 23 (WU) / Men Under 23 (WU) / Women Elite (WE) and Men Elite (ME). It is entered on the UCI Calendar as the Continental Championships event (UCI CC).



2.2 In accordance with the articles 2.10.008 and 2.10.017, the UCI ranking points shall be

awarded as follows:

Article 4 Race Office (Permanence)

The race office shall be located at Thai Cycling Association 286 Velodrome Huamark, Ramkhamhaeng Road, Bangkapi, Bangkok 10240 from January 1, 2023, till June 3, 2023. The office hours shall be 08:00-17:00 hrs.

And shall be in Star Convention Hotel (the official hotel of the Championships) from June 3, 2023, till the Championships finish. The Organizer may establish a temporary race office at the starting and/or finishing line on each race day.

Article 5 License Control / Numbers and Transponders Distributions

The license control shall be done on June 6, 2023, at a desirable room in the Star Convention Hotel (specific room shall be announced later) 13:00 hr.

Article 6 Team Managers' Meeting

The Team Managers' Meeting shall be held on June 6, 2023, at a desirable room in the Star Convention Hotel (specific room will be announced later) 16:00 hr.



Article 7 Starting Orders for TTT/ITT and Mixed Team Time Trial

7.1 The starting order and the starting interval for time trial events shall be determined by the Commissaire Panel and communicated to the team after the Team Managers' Meeting.

7.2 For Road Races, before each race: all riders concerned must be present at the sign on podium for signing on. The sign on shall be opened 60 minutes before starting time and shall be closed 15 minutes before starting time. The rider(s) who failed to sign on shall be penalized by the UCI regulations.

Article 8 Bicycles and Equipment Control

8.1 For all Time Trial events, all bicycles shall be checked by the UCI Commissaire prior to start. The checked bicycles could not be taken out of the bicycle control area. Otherwise, the bicycles shall have to be re-examined before the start.

8.2 For Time trial events, the change of bicycles can be done only by team car. The spare bicycles also must be checked by the Commissaire prior to the start.

8.3 For Road Race events, the change of bicycles can be done by team car, Neutral Service cars and in the pit (Only in the circuit).

Article 9 Radio Tour

9.1 Radio Tour frequency shall be announced at the Team Managers' Meeting.

9.2 Race information shall be broadcast throughout each race via the radio system.

9.3 The distribution of the radio to managers take place during the license control, all managers must sign, receive, and send back. And the transmitter must be returned to the organizer immediately after the last race of each team.



Article 10 Team Cars

10.1 Team cars are allowed to the race convoy in all competitions. All team cars shall be distributed to teams concerned at the starting line of each event and must be returned to the organizer immediately after the race finishes.

10.2 Teams are not allowed to use vehicles other than the ones provided by the organizer.

10.3 The team managers are responsible for all damage to the team vehicles incurred during their possession.

10.4 The order of the team cars in the race convoy shall be determined by the Commissaire Panel in conjunction with the organizer. The principle of the team car order shall depend on the number of riders per team at the start of each event.

Article 11 Neutral Service Support

11.1 The Neutral Service Support shall be provided by three (3) cars in each race.

11.2 The spare wheels are of a Shimano 12-speed sprocket and include the system of disc brakes and rim brakes.

11.3 The spare bicycles have strip pedal sizes of 48, 50, 52 and 54.

Article 12 Feeding

- 12.1 Feeding is not allowed during time trial events.
- 12.2 Feeding Zone in circuit races shall be near the starting-finishing line.
- 12.3 Feeding from a team car shall start at 30 km from the start and end at the last 10 km.



Article 13 Time of Arrival

- 13.1 There is no time limit for time trial competition. The time limit for road races is 10%.
- 13.2 The time can be added in case of special circumstances by the Commissaire Panel in agreement with the organizer.
- 13.3 For Men Elite races, riders who drop behind the main bunch for more than 5 minutes at the checkpoint located at the right turn from Route 1012 to Route 3 (182 km from the start) shall be eliminated from the race.

Article 14 Award Ceremonies

- 14.1 In accordance with article 1.1.112 of the UCI regulations, the best 3 riders (teams in team time trial) of each category must attend the official awarding ceremony.
- 14.2 For the individual time trial a <hot-seat> zone for the best 3 times shall be prepared near the finishing line.
- 14.3 Every competition of the Asian Road cycling Championships shall be awarded with:

The 1st place: Champion jersey, Gold medal and Certificate

The 2nd place: Silver medal and Certificate

The 3rd place: Bronze medal and Certificate

The 4th - 5th places: Certificate

Article 15 Doping Control

Doping controls shall be done according to the UCI regulations. The Doping Control station shall be located near the finishing line and shall be carried out by the International Testing Agency (ITA).



Article 16 Penalties

Penalties shall be applied in accordance with the UCI regulations.

Article 17 Responsibilities

- 17.1 Under no circumstances shall the Organizers and the ACC be liable for any accidents or damages incurred during the practices and the competitions.
- 17.2 The organizers and the ACC disclaim all responsibilities to the riders and others in the event of an accident.

For all cases not covered by these specific regulations, UCI tiles shall apply.

Article 18 Accommodation/Transportation

18.1 All participating teams must stay in the official hotel. The cost for accommodation, airport pick up, ground transportation in Thailand and race's services shall be charged USD 90 per day per person on the double basis. Participants requiring single accommodation must notify the organizer in advance and shall be charged USD 110 per day per person.

Payment will be made by bank transfer or upon arrival at the latest before check-in.

18.2 All registered participants should be provided with the ID card which must be presented to the staff when staying at an official hotel and/or accessing restricted areas of the Championships.

Article 19 Environmental Protection

Due to some parts of the race routes being in environmentally sensitive areas. All parties involved are prohibited from disposing of trash outside the designated waste zone set up by the organizer. In case of violation of regulations, offenders may be prosecuted by the law in addition to UCI penalties.

SAFE DRIVING

Safety for all riders, race support staff and spectators during the race is the number one priority when using a motor vehicle in a race convoy. Here is summary of the main driving guidelines and regulations to follow and respect during the 2023 Asian Road Cycling Championships in Thailand.

MANDATORY FOR ALL DRIVERS

- To have a valid UCI license for the 2023 season (including third-party liability insurance);
- Obligation to respect UCI regulations and Guidelines for vehicle circulation in the race convoy
- Each driver must focus on one thing: Driving the vehicle in a responsible manner! It is recommended that the Sport Director or the Nation Team Coach in charge considers being the passenger and an experienced driver focuses on driving the vehicle exclusively.
