1. Sport Information

1.1 Cycling Track Competition

1.1.1 Competition Date

The Cycling Track competition of the 19th Asian Games will be held from 26 to 29 September 2023 at Chun ' an Jieshou Sports Centre.

1.1.2 Competition Venue

The Cycling Track competition of the 19th Asian Games will be held at Chun ' an Jieshou Sports Centre Velodrome in Chun ' an County. The venue has a seating capacity of 3,040. The Cycling Track competition venue will be used as the training venue as well. The venue is about 600 metres away from the Chun ' an Athletes Sub-village.

1.1.3 Number and Name of Events

The Cycling Track competition of the 19th Asian Games consists of 12 events as follows:

- Men: Sprint, Keirin, Omnium, Madison, Team Sprint, Team Pursuit
- Women: Sprint, Keirin, Omnium, Madison, Team Sprint, Team Pursuit

1.4 Competition Rules

The Cycling Track competition of the 19th Asian Games will be held as per the latest rules and regulations of the Union Cycliste Internationale (UCI).

Detailed information is available on the website of the UCI: www.uci.org.

In case of any disagreement in the interpretation of the UCI rules and regulations, the English version shall prevail. Any unforeseen circumstances not covered by the rules and regulations shall be resolved in accordance with the *OCA Constitution & Rules*.

1.5 Competition Format

The Cycling Track competition will be held as per the UCI Cycling Regulations in force during the Games-time.

Grouping: Groups shall be divided based on entry numbers and the UCI regulations.

● Sprint:

The 200m Time Trial will select male and female athletes (16 respectively) into the 1/16 Final and 1/8 Final. Winners will advance to the next round while losers will compete in repechages. The competition will have the best of three heats from the 1/4 Final on. Winners will advance to the 1/2 Final while losers compete once for 5th to 8th places. Two (2) winners of the 1/2 Final will compete for the 1st and 2nd places while losers compete for 3rd and 4th places.

● Madison:

The Madison event will have teams of two (2) male and two (2) female athletes competing in 50 kilometres (200 laps) or 30 kilometres (120 laps)

respectively. There will be a sprint after every 10 laps, and five (5) points, three (3) points, two (2) points and one (1) point will be awarded to the first, second, third and fourth places in the sprint lap. Results are determined according to the accumulated points won by teams through laps (20 points for gaining a lap and -20 points for losing a lap) and intermediate and final sprints. In case of equal points, the final placing shall be determined by the order of the final sprint.

● Team Pursuit:

The team pursuit is a race with two opposing teams made up of four (4) athletes, starting on each side of the track and racing 4 kilometers. The winner is determined by either catching the other team or recording the fastest time. The time shall be measured on the front wheel of the third rider of each team hitting the finish line.

The competition consists of the qualifying round, first round and final round. The team manager must notify the commissaires of any changes at least 30 minutes before the relevant competition round start.

In the qualifying round, teams may start ride against the clock one by one. Top eight (8) teams will advance to the first round. In the first round, winning teams of 1 vs 4 and 2 vs 3 will compete for the 1st to 2nd place, while the remaining six (6) teams will ranked based on their results in the first round and shall dispute the finals as follows:

The two fastest teams shall ride the final for 3rd and 4th places.

● Team Sprint:

The Team Sprint is a race with two opposing teams, each of whose riders shall lead for one lap. The event is run over three laps of a track by teams of three riders for both men and women. Teams shall be made up of riders entered for this event. The composition of a team may be modified from one heat to another. An incomplete team may not take the start. The team manager must



notify the commissaires of any changes at least 30 minutes before the relevant competition round start.

The competition consists of the qualifying round, first round and final round. Top eight (8) teams of the qualifying round will advance to the first round. The four winning teams from the first competition round shall dispute the finals. The teams having made the two best times shall ride the final for first and second places and the other two teams shall ride the final for third and fourth places. Teams beaten during first competition round shall be placed fifth to eighth according to their times at that stage of the competition.

- **Keirin:**

Riders compete in a sprint after completing a number of laps behind a motorised pacer who leaves the track three (3) laps to go (250m track). The motorised pacer shall start at 30km/h and speed up gradually to 50km/h before leaving the track. An elimination system will be adopted based on the number of riders. Winners will advance to the next round while losers compete in repechages until the final places are determined.

- **Omnium:**

The Omnium consists of four (4) events, which shall be held over one (1) day in prescribed order. Final placings shall be determined by cumulative points of the events. The order goes as: scratch, tempo, elimination and point race. The starting order of the scratch shall be defined according to the latest UCI Omnium Ranking. In case there is no basis available, the starting order shall be determined by draw. The starting order of other events shall be based on the current intermediate Omnium classification. In the Omnium competition, results and ranking of each event as well as the ranking of cumulative points shall be announced upon completion of the concerned event. Meanwhile, the starting order of the next event shall be announced. For all the Omnium races, riders shall

be lined up in single file along the railing and in the sprinter's lane in the order listed on the start list. A rider will lead for one (1) lap and then other riders set off.

Any rider failing to complete one of the events shall not be allowed to take part in the subsequent events and shall be considered to have abandoned the competition. The rider shall therefore be recorded in the final classification after the last placed rider with the provision "DNF" (did not finish) and no rank.

Unless otherwise stipulated, riders shall comply with all the race procedures and specific rules and regulations.

1.6 Protests and Appeals

Protests and appeals shall be handled as per the latest UCI competition rules. All appeals of a technical nature will be the responsibilities of the UCI or Asian Cycling Confederation (ACC).

Any athlete and/or their respective NOC may appeal to the Court of Arbitration for Sport (CAS), in the event that the athlete and/or their NOC believes that there has been violation of the UCI/ACC technical rules or the *OCA Constitution and Rules*, so long as the appeal is not related to reversing the decision of the referee or the result.

1.7 Late Athlete Replacement Policy

The deadline for the Entry by Name of the 19th Asian Games is 15 July 2023. The received list of participating athletes will be officially finalised once they are confirmed to be consistent with originals at the DRM scheduled to be held from 9 to 22 September 2023.



However, under exceptional circumstances (e.g., due to injury or other medical emergencies) and on a case-by-case basis, the OCA and relevant IF/AF may allow the permanent replacement of an athlete by others after consulting with appropriate medical specialists. The replacement of the athlete after 15 July 2023 is possible providing that:

A) The replacement athlete is entitled and eligible to take part in the 19th Asian Games in accordance with the *OCA Constitution and Rules*.

B) The appropriate NOC had applied for accreditation for the replacement athlete prior to the accreditation application deadline on 20 May 2023.

C) No doping control issues are pending concerning the replacement athlete.

In addition, making athlete replacements is possible from the end of DRM to one day prior to the Technical Meeting of Cycling Track (24 September 2023), but the following procedures must be followed to gain approval:

A) The relevant NOC must duly complete the *Late Replacement of Athletes Form* (see Appendix 3) for the athlete being replaced and the replacement athlete.

B) The Hangzhou Asian Games Identity and Accreditation Card (HAGIAC) of the replaced athlete must be withdrawn and handed over either to the Accreditation Centre (MAC) or to Venue Accreditation Office (VAO).

C) An *Entry by Name Form* must be duly completed by the relevant NOC for the replacement athlete.

NOCs are required to submit all requests for athlete replacement and relevant materials to HAGOC Sport Entries Centre to complete all necessary formalities. The Sport Entries Centre will forward all received copies of relevant documents to the Accreditation Centre and the OCA Sports Committee.

These policies may be adjusted or revised by the OCA under exceptional circumstances.

1.8 Clothing and Equipment

Equipment used and clothing worn by athletes and other relevant participants in the competition must comply with the rules and regulations of the OCA and UCI. Neither athletes nor technical officials will be permitted to attach any form of commercial advertising to their competition uniforms without prior approval from the OCA and HAGOC.

1.9 Article 70 of The *OCA Constitution & Rules*

- The Executive Board (EB) determines the principles and conditions under which any form of advertising or other publicity may be authorised;

- No form of advertising or other publicity shall be allowed in and above the stadium, venues and other competition areas which are considered as part of the OCA GAMES sites, other than that of the Games commercial affiliates. Commercial installations and advertising signs shall not be allowed in the stadium, venues or other OCA GAMES sites;

- No kind of demonstration or commercial, political, religious or racial propaganda is permitted in the Asian Games official sites, venues, host city and other areas.

No form of publicity or propaganda, commercial or otherwise, may appear on persons, sportswear, accessories or, more generally, on any article of clothing or equipment whatsoever worn or used by the athletes or other participants in the OCA GAMES, except for identification of the manufacturer of the article or equipment concerned, provided that such identification shall not be marked conspicuously for advertising purposes. The provisions of the OCA Commercial Guidelines apply.

2.Competition Procedures

2.1 Pre-competition Procedures

2.1.1 Competition Draw

The draw will be conducted by the commissaires as needed during the competition.

2.1.2 Venue Familiarisation

Venue familiarisation will be arranged from 23 to 25 September 2023. During this period, the athletes of each delegation are expected to be present at the Field of Play (FOP) according to the announced time schedule. The date and time for venue familiarisation are as follows:

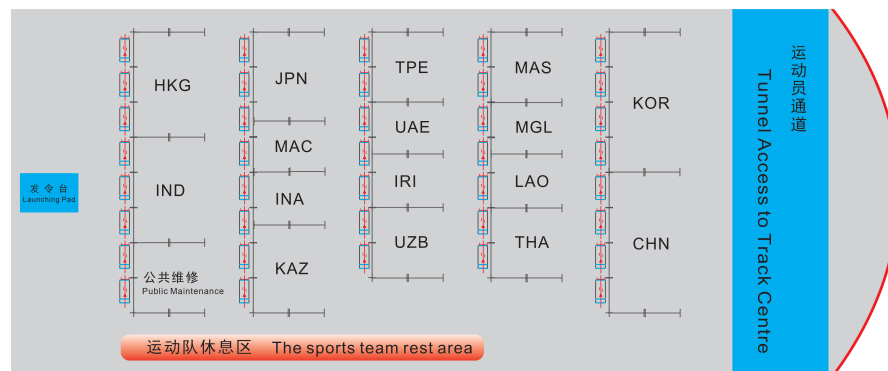

2.1.4 Technical Meeting

The Technical Meeting will be hosted by the Technical Delegate and conducted in accordance with the UCI rules and regulations. Each participating sport team may assign up to two (2) representatives (team leaders and/or coaches) to attend the meeting.

The detailed schedule is as follows:

2.1.5 Equipment Check

Athlete equipment check will take place from 26 to 29 September 2023 during the roll call before each event begins. All athletes must check their equipment before the start of official training and competition.

2.1.6 Distribution of Bibs

The number bibs must be provided by HAGOC only. During the competition, athletes must wear their number bibs. The bibs must not be folded, altered, or

modified in any way. Athletes are required to wear the designated number bibs according to the competition rules and ensure that the bibs are clearly visible to all spectators.

2.1.7 Rescue and Safety

Starting from 24 September 2023, rescue services for the Cycling Track competition will be available during the Field of Play's (FOP) opening for training. During the training and competition, medical rescue staff will set up workstations along the ramps of the main and secondary tracks in the FOP area. Ambulances will be parked at designated locations outside the competition venue.

2.2 Competition Procedures

2.2.1 Access to the FOP

Only Cycling Track athletes who will compete in the relevant event will be allowed in the FOP during the competition.

2.2.2 Warm-up

After arriving at the venue, athletes with competition sessions scheduled may go to the athletes lounge area for a break or warm up in their respective preparation zones in order of their competition times.

The participating teams can train on the cycling tracks 60 minutes before each match starts. All teams must train according to their training schedules. During the official training, athletes must wear helmets and refrain from using road bikes on the track or using starting devices and pacing vehicles.



2.2.3 Roll Call

Athletes must arrive at the Call Area of the FOP 15 minutes before the competition starts to have their bikes and number bibs validated. The clothing worn by athletes must comply with relevant rules and regulations.

2.3 Post-competition Procedures

2.3.1 Leave the FOP

After the athletes finish their competition, they will pass through the mixed zone. Before the Victory Ceremony, the top three (3) athletes will be accompanied by a volunteer, who will inform them of the time for the Victory Ceremony and escort them through the athlete recovery area and the waiting area.

After the Victory Ceremony, venue staff will guide the athletes to the exits.

2.3.2 Results

Upon the conclusion of each competition, the results will be delivered to the Sport Information Desk (SID) and released on the Games INFO System.

2.3.3 Results Book and USB Flash Drive

After the 19th Asian Games, HAGOC will send all NOCs the *Results Books* of all sports/disciplines contested at the Games and provide a USB flash drive.

2.3.4 Victory Ceremony

Each medal event will hold a Victory Ceremony at the venue where the final competition is held. At the Victory Ceremony, medals and bouquets will be presented to the top three (3) athletes or teams (including ties). National (NOC) flags will be raised, and the respective anthem of the gold medalists will be played at the same time. The Victory Ceremony will be conducted in both Chinese and English. At the Victory Ceremony, the participating athletes and teams must wear their NOC official award-winning uniforms. Athletes or teams are not allowed to bring personal items such as flags, banners, or mobile phones, and their HAGIACs must be kept out of sight.

After the Victory Ceremony, the top three (3) athletes or teams (including ties) will be awarded medal boxes, which will be sent to the athletes lounge, and the top eight (8) athletes or teams will be awarded victory diplomas, which will be collected by their team leaders.

2.3.5 Doping Control

HAGOC is committed to clean sport, protecting athletes' health and promoting fair play. Under the guidance of China Anti-Doping Agency (CHINADA) authorised by the OCA, HAGOC will ensure that the anti-doping programme of the 19th Asian Games complies with the *World Anti-Doping Code*. During the Games time, the OCA, as the Testing Authority (TA) and Results Management Authority (RMA), will coordinate and guide the anti-doping programme. The International Testing Agency (ITA) will manage part of the anti-doping programme with the authorisation from the OCA. CHINADA will serve as the Sample Collection Authority (SCA), and the Beijing Anti-Doping Laboratory will be responsible for the sample analysis.

The anti-doping programme of the 19th Asian Games will:



- Come into force in accordance with the *World Anti-Doping Code* (hereinafter as “*the Code*”), the *OCA Anti-Doping Rules* (hereinafter as “*the Rules*”) and The *19th Asian Games Hangzhou 2022 Doping Control Guide* (hereinafter as “*the Guide*” in this section). *The Rules* approved by the OCA outlines Adverse Analytical Findings and other anti-doping rule violations and corresponding management procedures. *The Rules* also requires athletes to abide by the *2023 Prohibited List* published by the World Anti-Doping Agency (WADA).

- Provide detailed information in the Guide, which was provided to all participating NOCs in late March.

- Share intelligence with the OCA Medical Committee, the ITA, IFs, National Anti-Doping Organisations (NADOs), Regional Anti-Doping Organisations (RADOs) and other law enforcement agencies.

- Conduct in-competition and out-of-competition testing anytime and anywhere, without advance notification, from the opening of the Athletes Village on 16 September 2023 to the Closing Ceremony of the Games on 8 October 2023. In-competition refers to “the period from 23:59 on the day before a competition in which the athlete is scheduled to participate to the end of the sample collection process related to the competition”, and out-of-competition refers to “any period that is not in-competition”, as stipulated in *the Code*, *the International Standard for Testing and Investigations* and *the Rules*;

- Require any athlete who is eligible to compete in the 19th Asian Games to undergo doping control tests during the Games. An athlete may be subject to such tests more than once. Athletes’ urine and/or blood samples will be collected in the 19th Asian Games based on the Testing Distribution Plan.

- Conduct doping control tests anywhere including but not limited to: Doping Control Stations in the Athletes Village (athletes sub-villages), competition

venues, training venues, or other athletes’ accommodations.

- Recruit highly skilled Doping Control Officers (DCOs) with good language and communication skills from China and other countries and regions in Asia to conduct sample collection.

- Recruit professional volunteers as doping control chaperones to perform athletes notification.

- Deliver the samples to Beijing Anti-Doping Laboratory that is accredited by WADA, where the samples will be analysed in accordance with WADA standards.

Note: Upon request by the International Testing Agency (ITA), athletes who set a new world and/or Asian record will be required to receive doping control tests from DCOs.

To ratify a national record, an NOC may require the athlete who sets the record to receive doping control tests. The costs for such tests shall be borne by the concerned athletes or their NOCs. For details about the application and payment process, please refer to *The 19th Asian Games Hangzhou 2022 Doping Control Guide*.

2.3.6 Mixed Zone

Athletes must pass through the mixed zone at the end of a competition, so that they can be interviewed by accredited media as soon as possible after the competition ends. Although athletes must pass through the mixed zone after a competition, they are not obliged to comply with any request to be interviewed.

After a Victory Ceremony, athletes and teams who have won medals must pass through the mixed zone and allow themselves to be interviewed by accredited media (if necessary).



2.3.7 Press Conference

After the final of each event, a post-competition press conference will be arranged. The frequency and participants will be determined based on the special needs of each sport/discipline. Each AF's media officer is required to reach an agreement with the Venue Press Operations Manager of the concerning sport/discipline in advance on the process and form of the press conference.

At the press conference, professional interpretation between English, Chinese and the language spoken by the participating athlete will be provided if he or she speaks Arabic, Japanese, Korean or Russian. In the event that the participating athlete speaks a language other than the aforementioned ones, the Press Attach é(s) of the relevant NOC shall be responsible for translating his/her speeches into English.

After entering the press operations zone, press conference participants will be guided by the staff at the press conference hall or volunteers. AFs and competition operations team of the venue will provide necessary support and assistance, to ensure that participants will attend the press conference on time.

3. Training

3.1 Training Venue

The Cycling Track training venue of the 19th Asian Games is Chun' an Jieshou Sports Centre Velodrome, which will also be used as the Cycling Track competition venue.

Totally, there are 40 bike rollers used for training.

3.2 Training Rules

The Cycling Track official training of the 19th Asian Games will be arranged from 24 to 25 September 2023.

4. Transport

For details, see *The 19th Asian Games Transport Guide* released by the Transport Services Team of HAGOC in August 2023.

4.1 Transport Services for Competitions

Round-trip services will be provided to transport athletes and team officials from the Athletes Village (athletes sub-villages) to their competition venues. In principle, the services will be available from three (3) hours before the competition starts to three (3) hours after it ends. Actual service hours may be further adjusted, to ensure they are compatible with the competition schedule, and meet other competition-related requirements.

Athletes and team officials participating in non-team events will be entitled to round-trip shuttle services between the Athletes Village (athletes sub-villages) and the competition venues.

4.2 Transport Services for Training

Athletes and team officials will be provided with round-trip transport services from the Athletes Village (athletes sub-villages) to their training venues.

4.3 Transport Services for Games-spectating Athletes and Team Officials

Same sport/discipline Games-spectating athletes and team officials are entitled to transport services that are provided for athletes and team officials participating in competitions/training sessions. However, priority will always be given to the athletes and team officials taking part in competition/training on the day.

Different sport/discipline Games-spectating athletes and team officials may go to the competition venues through free public transport or other means.

Athletes and team officials intending to spectate competitions in another competition zone may first enjoy shuttle services between competition zones to travel to the corresponding Athletes Village (athletes sub-villages) in Ningbo, Tonglu, Chun' an and Hangzhou, while the traveling between Wenzhou, Jinhua and Hangzhou need to first take the high-speed train, and then go to the corresponding competition venues using local shuttle services for Games-spectating athletes and team officials.

4.4 Transport Services for Opening and Closing Ceremonies

4.4.1 Service Period

The services will be available on 23 September 2023 (Opening Ceremony) and 8 October 2023 (Closing Ceremony).

4.4.2 Service Description

Athletes and team officials will be provided with round-trip transport services between the Athletes Village and the Opening/Closing Ceremony venue.



5. General Information

5.1 Arrivals and Departures (A&D)

5.1.1 Entry with Passports and HAGIACs

Non-Chinese nationals will be allowed multiple entries into/exits from the Chinese mainland between 00:00 on 24 August 2023 and 24:00 on 23 October 2023 (Beijing time) upon presentation of their valid passports (or other international travel documents) and HAGIACs (including electronic identity and accreditation cards or “E-HAGIACs”) issued by HAGOC.

5.1.2 A&D Information

HAGOC will collect and update the A&D information of NOCs through the Arrivals and Departures System (ADS). NOCs are expected to log in to the System between 22 July and 22 August 2023 as early as possible and enter detailed A&D information. Any incomplete A&D information may impact on the arrangements for A&D services and A&D experience. Any delay in the provision of A&D information may result in NOCs not being able to access adequate A&D services. In this case, the NOC may need to arrange their A&D by themselves.

NOCs can update their A&D information in the ADS no later than 48 hours prior to their departure for China. After arrival, NOC delegation members may also have their A&D information updated at the Arrivals & Departures Desk of the NOC Services Centre in the Athletes Village (athletes sub-villages).

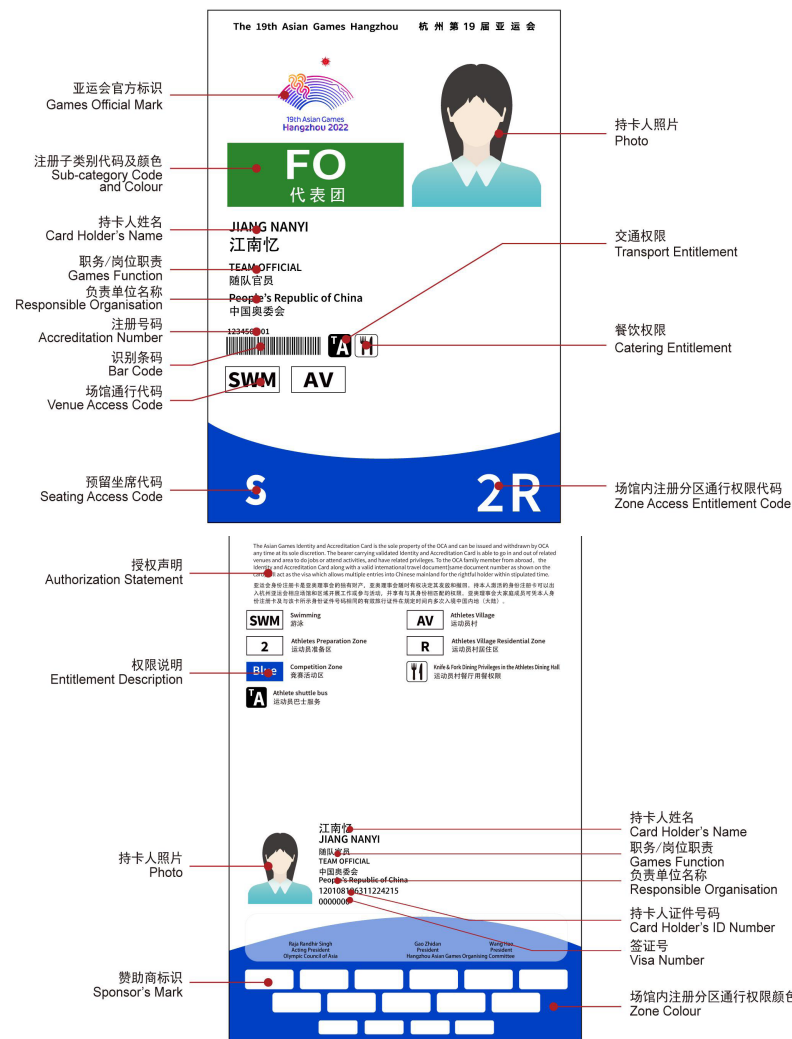
HAGOC will provide a variety of Games services at Hangzhoudong Railway Station, including Pre-valid HAGIAC validation, procedural guide, and transport services between official accommodation sites and Hangzhoudong Railway Station.

5.2 Accreditation

As an official identity document, the 19th Asian Games Identity and Accreditation Card (HAGIAC), issued by HAGOC with the authorisation of the OCA, certifies the holder's eligibility to take part in the Games. After HAGIACs being validated, holders may access Games venues and zones to perform their duties or participate in activities, and enjoy necessary access entitlements. Non-

Chinese nationals will be allowed multiple entries into/exits from the Chinese mainland between 00:00 on 24 August 2023 and 24:00 on 23 October 2023 (Beijing time) upon presentation of their valid passports (or other international travel documents) and HAGIACs issued by HAGOC. To enter the Chinese mainland, HAGIAC holders should make sure that the information contained in their valid passports or other international travel documents is consistent with that provided in their accreditation applications. It is recommended that all non-Chinese NOC delegation members should hold a valid passport or other international travel documents with an expiry date no earlier than 31 December 2023. A Pre-valid HAGIAC could not be validated if its holder's information in the Accreditation System is inconsistent with that on his or her valid identity document. In this case, the card holder shall report it to his or her NOC, re-submit his or her accreditation information and obtain a new Pre-valid HAGIACHAGIAC

in accordance with accreditation policies and procedures. The card holder shall take responsibilities arising therefrom.

5.2.2 Access Code

The venue access code on the front of HAGIAC shows the access to competition venues and/or non-competition venues granted to the holder. The description of the access code can be found on the back of the card.

Accreditation zones are Games venues and zones that HAGIAC holders have access to and where they perform their duties or participate in activities, and enjoy corresponding entitlements;

5.2.3 Upgrade Transferable Accreditation Card

HAGOC will distribute a certain number of Upgrade Transferable Accreditation Cards (U Cards) to each NOC.

The U Card enables NOCs to upgrade the access entitlements of their accredited members. When using a U Card, the holder must present it together with his or her HAGIAC.

Each NOC will receive one (1) U Card for every 20 participating athletes. NOC delegations with less than 20 participating athletes will receive one (1) U Card.

U Card holders can access all competition venues and their General Circulation Zones (WHITE Zone), OCA Family Zones (Zone 6), and reserved seating.

A U Card is non-nominated, and there is no limit on the number of times it may be transferred. Lost U Cards will not be reissued.

U Cards will not provide the holders with prime events access entitlement.

5.2.4. Handling of Special Cases

(1) Loss or damage of Pre-valid HAGIACs before entry into the Chinese mainland

If a Pre-valid HAGIAC is lost or damaged before its holder enters the Chinese mainland, the holder shall immediately notify his or her NOC, which shall then notify HAGOC in writing.

HAGOC will cancel the lost or damaged Pre-valid HAGIAC in the Accreditation System. Cancelled Pre-valid HAGIACs cannot be validated.

Furthermore, the applicant will have to obtain a visa or other entry-exit



documents for entry into/exit from the Chinese mainland. HAGOC will provide necessary assistance accordingly. After entering the Chinese mainland, the applicant can go to the MAC or an Accreditation Sub-centre and fill in a HAGIAC reissuance application form to apply for a new Pre-valid HAGIAC.

(2) Loss or damage of validated HAGIACs

If a validated HAGIAC is lost or damaged, its holder shall immediately notify his or her NOC, which shall then notify HAGOC in writing. The lost or damaged HAGIACs will be cancelled in the Accreditation System and cannot be validated again.

The MAC or Accreditation Sub-centres can produce a new card only after having received an applicant's HAGIAC reissuance application form signed and stamped by his or her NOC. Before the new HAGIAC is issued, the card holder must return the damaged HAGIAC to the MAC or an Accreditation Sub-centre.

5.3 Games-spectating Policy for Athletes and Team Officials

NOC delegations submit the DDA (different discipline athlete) tickets request form to the NOC Services Team before 10:00 one (1) day ahead of the competition day. The NOC Services Team will allocate tickets to the requesting NOC delegations based on the number and sessions of available DDA tickets. Between 17:00 and 19:00 the day before the competition day, the Chef de Mission, Deputy Chef de Mission or Proxy Card holder of the concerned delegation may collect their DDA tickets at the NOC Services Centre. Any uncollected tickets will be collected by other NOC delegations on a first-come, first-served basis after 19:00. The delegations will be required to fill in the *DDA Tickets Collection Form* according to the actual situation.

5.4 Ceremonies

● Opening Ceremony

The Opening Ceremony will be held at Hangzhou Olympic Sports Centre Stadium at 20:00, 23 September 2023. Each NOC delegation can send a certain number of athletes and team officials to take part in the Athletes Parade at the Opening Ceremony. The quota for Athletes Parade participants and the policy on Marching Passes will be released later.

● Marching Order

NOC delegations taking part in the Athletes Parade will be arranged in the alphabetical order as per Annexure III of the *OCA Constitution and Rules*, except that the host country shall be the last.

● Uniforms

The official uniforms and accessories worn by participants in the Athletes Parade should comply with the security requirements of the Opening Ceremony and the OCA. Please note that it is not allowed to carry bags during the parade.

● Opening Ceremony Tickets

HAGOC, based on the actual situation of the Opening Ceremony programme, will provide seats and tickets for the athletes and team officials attending the Opening Ceremony.

● Catering

Athletes and team officials participating in the Opening Ceremony will be provided with boxed meals (room temperature).

● Closing Ceremony

The Closing Ceremony will be held at Hangzhou Olympic Sports Centre Stadium at 20:00, 8 October 2023.

The flag bearers of NOC delegations will march in order. Athletes will enter the stadium en masse without any groupings.

Requirements on uniforms, items, as well as services for tickets, catering, and other services for the Closing Ceremony will be of a similar standard to those for the Opening Ceremony.

● Team Welcome Ceremony

From the day when the Athletes Village opens to one (1) day before the Opening Ceremony of the Games, HAGOC will hold Team Welcome Ceremonies for NOC delegations arriving at the Athletes Village. Team Welcome Ceremonies will not be held in athletes sub-villages.



5.5 Medical Services

HAGOC will work closely with the public health authorities of the host city and co-host cities to prevent and control infectious diseases, monitor the quality of air, drinking water, and food, promote public hygiene and sexual health, and enforce smoking control.

Smoking is prohibited in all indoor areas of the Athletes Village and Games venues, as well as the FOPs and seating areas in stadiums.

5.6 Sport Services

➤ SIC

The SIC, located on the first floor, No.2 Building, Zone 7 of the Athletes Village, will provide information services such as competition results, and competition/training schedule. The SIC will also assist with sport-related inquiries, such as bookings or making changes to training sessions, coordinating training schedules, and handling sport-related issues.

The pre-opening of the SIC will be from 9 September 2023, operating between 08:00 and 20:00 each day, till its official opening. It will be officially open between 07:00 and 22:00 each day from 16 September to 11 October 2023, and closed upon conclusion of all competitions.

The SIC will provide the following sports information and services:

- Sport-related information from the 19th Asian Games competition management team and IFs/AFs and replies to competition-related questions;
- Competition results, draws, daily training schedules, and other key information;
- Distribution of training schedules to each participating team, reservation of

training time and venues;

- Detailed weather data and updates;
- Management of INFO terminal settings to provide search results related to competition;
- Facilitation of other matters.

Detailed and accurate competition materials will also be available at SIDs in competition venues.

Please note that entry into the SIC will only be granted to team leaders or coaches with their valid HAGIACs.

➤ SID

The SIDs are set up at competition venues to provide the following sport-related information for delegations:

- Competition schedule
- Training schedule
- Entry lists
- Competition results
- Technical Meeting information

The service hours of SIDs will be subject to the schedule of sport/discipline contested in their respective venues. On a competition day, a SID will open one (1) hour before the first competition and close one (1) hour after the last competition.

➤ Games INFO

Games INFO is the Games information system providing information such as competition schedules, results and reports, athletes' profiles, medal standings,



new records, and news.

Games INFO is in English. The content displayed includes:

myINFO is the Internet sub-system of the INFO System. Its link will be provided on the official website of the Games. HAGOC will issue register tokens to designated users to meet the needs of accredited media for various event news data and remote Internet access in the digital era. Authenticated users will be able to access the INFO System using their devices (PC and tablet) and view Games-related information.

5.8 Language Services

HAGOC will provide volunteer language assistance, over-the-phone interpretation and professional interpretation for NOC delegations and other Games stakeholders.

5.8.1 Volunteer Language Assistance

Language volunteers will be stationed at all competition venues and provide language services mainly in Chinese and English. Venue-based language services supervisors will send volunteers to offer language services to delegations if there is such a need.

Please note that language volunteers will not be available at training venues and during training sessions.

Chinese and English volunteer language assistance will be available at the Asian Games Village, the Main Media Centre (MMC) and the OCA Family Headquarters Hotel.

5.8.2 Over-the-phone Interpretation

In the event that volunteer language assistance is not available, the Multilingual Call Centre will provide over-the-phone interpretation for NOC delegations in need.

The Multilingual Call Centre will be in operation from 8 September to 11 October 2023, providing over-the-phone interpretation 24 hours a day in Chinese and English, as well as Chinese-to-other-languages interpretation from 06:00 to 22:00 each day.

The Multilingual Call Centre hotline number and language pairs will be provided before the pre-opening of the Athletes Village.

5.8.3 Professional Interpretation

HAGOC will provide professional interpretation on site or remotely for press conferences and meetings at all competition and non-competition venues.

5.9 Weather Services

- The 19th Asian Games Weather Centre (“ Asian Games Weather Centre ”) will provide weather information mainly through the Games INFO System and the Go Hangzhou app.

5.10 Security

During the 19th Asian Games, appropriate and effective security measures

will be taken in all venues of the Games in the host city and co-host cities, so as to create a secure environment for all Games participants.

All NOC delegation members must abide by Chinese laws and the 19th Asian Games security regulations during their stay in China.

5.10.1 Venues in Lockdown

In line with their functions and actual security needs, all Games venues will be kept in lockdown during the Games, and security perimeters and enclosed security zones will be set up accordingly.

Multiple venues located within the same enclosed security zone will be regarded as a venue cluster, and this venue cluster will be kept in lockdown during the Games time. Each pedestrian or vehicle must present a valid ticket and HAGIAC or VAPP, and undergo a security check to enter an enclosed venue cluster. To gain entry to any specific venue within a venue cluster, only tickets and HAGIACs or VAPPs will be checked and no further security checks required.

Shuttle buses that accord with the “clean to clean” principle will be exempt from security screening when entering the enclosed security zones.

5.10.2 Venue Access Control

Ticket and accreditation check point, pedestrian screening area, and vehicle screening area will be set up at the entrance(s) of all security enclosed zones.

After the security sweep and lockdown, all pedestrians and vehicles must present their valid tickets and HAGIACs or VAPPs, go through ticket and accreditation check and security check before being allowed to enter the venue.

5.10.3 Transport Security

During the Games time, HAGOC will work closely with departments of the municipal government to develop Games-time transport plans for competition



venues, independent training venues, the Athletes Village (athletes sub-villages), official hotels, etc., and set up Asian Games Lanes with considerations of the competition schedule, venue distribution, and road conditions and traffic, so as to ensure smooth transport operations during the Games time.

5.10.4 Emergency Services

In case of an emergency, NOC delegations can approach HAGOC staff members or security guards for emergency assistance in venues, or directly call 110 (police), 119 (fire brigade) or 120 (medical aid) for help.

5.10.5 Lists of Prohibited and Restricted Items and Prohibited Acts at Venues

Please visit Hangzhou 2022 NOCnet for lists of prohibited and restricted items and prohibited acts at venues, which will be released before the Games.

5.10.6 Security Liaison

During the Games, the Security Department of HAGOC will set up a security communication mechanism to facilitate communications between NOC delegation members and the Security Department.

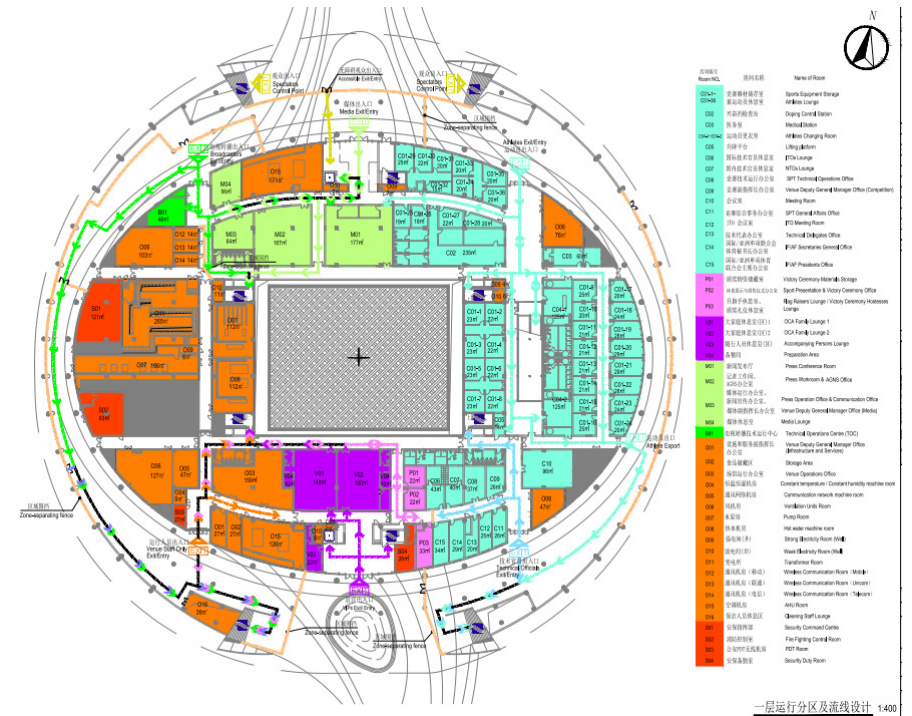

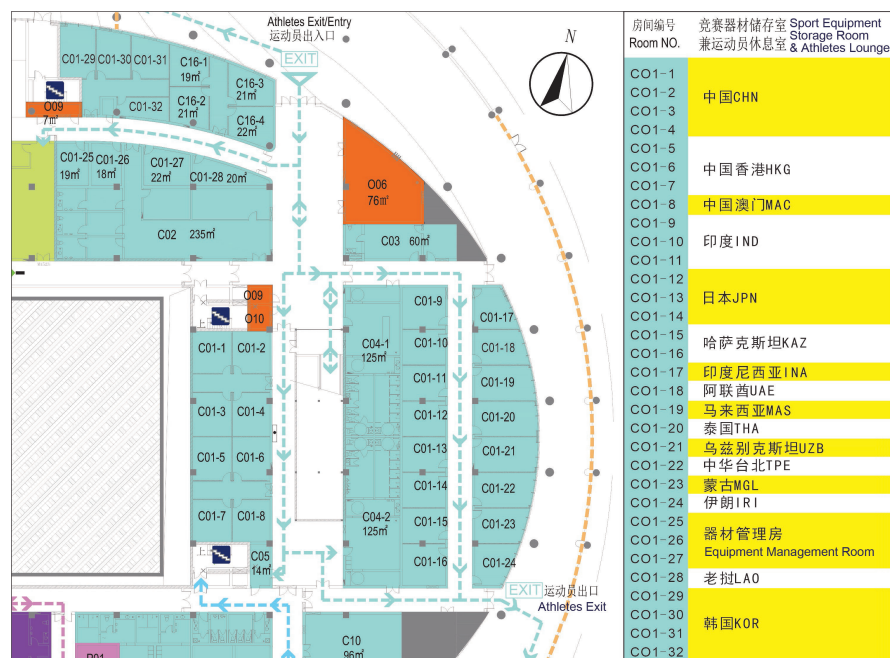
