

7 Riders category.

The event is for the riders of the National Federations affiliated to the Asian Cycling Confederation (ACC) and the championships comprise the events and categories as follows:

a. Down hill (DHI)

- Men Elite (Age 19 years old and over) born year 2004 and older
- Women Elite (Age 19 years old and over) born year 2004 and older
- Men Junior (Age 17-18 years old) born year 2005-2006
- Women Junior (Age 17-18 years old) born year 2005-2006 Each Federation can send the maximum 4 riders for DHI Men and Women category.

b. Cross Country Olympic (XCO)

- Men Elite (Age 19 years old and over) born year 2004 and older
- Women Elite (Age 19 years old and over) born year 2004 and older
- Men Junior (Age 17-18 years old) born year 2005-2006
- Women Junior (Age 17-18 years old) born year 2005-2006 Each Federation can send the maximum 4 riders for DHI Men and Women category.

c. Cross Country Team Relay (XCR)

1 Men Elite, 1 Women Elite, 1 U23 (Men or Women), 1 Junior (Men or Women), + 1 rider from any above category any gender (* 1 women rider must be included.) Each Federation can send only one team which will be comprised 5 riders. At least 5 countries with 6 riders must participate to meet UCI requirements. However, since we are not expected to participate in more than 5 countries, we are planning to hold the event with 5 riders per team. Please note that UCI points are not given on XCR.

d. Cross Country Eliminator (XCE)

- Men (Age 17 years old and over) born year 2005 and older
- Women (Age 17 years old and over) born year 2005 and older Each Federation can send the maximum 4 riders for XCE Men and Women category.

All participating teams have to attend license control to present riders licenses and confirm entries.

Notes:

- → Injury or illness will not be accepted as a valid circumstance unless the riders is declared unfit to start by the official doctor
- → At the time of the rider's confirmation, team managers must present their National outfit to the commissaires

- → Race numbers must be collected at the time stated in the program schedule.
- → Rider license and passports must be submitted to the commissaire panel. The race number for the team relay shall be distributed in the morning of the event in accordance with the instructions given by the commissaires panel at the team manager's meeting.
- → A rider shall ensure that their race number is visible and legible at all time. The race number shall be well fixed and may not be folded or altered.
- → Please note that training will not be authorized without a number plate. The temporary number plate for the training can be collected upon arrival the teams

9. Accreditation:

- a. For the accreditation card, click here
- b. Deadline for the registration of accreditation card: 15th Oct. 2023
- c. Accreditation cards can be collected at the time of entry confirmation

10. Race Procedure:

XCO, XCE and XCR

- → In Mass start events, riders must be called to the start not earlier than 20 minutes before the scheduled start of the race. This period can be reduced as per the circumstances.
- → The riders line up in the order in which, they are to be called to the start line. The number of riders on each line is decided by the president of the commissaires panel and supervised by a commissaire. The rider himself decides, which position on the line to take.
- → Once the riders are lined up, warm-up (by rollers, turbo trainer, etc.) is excluded inside or outside the start area.
- → The start is given by the start commissaire using the following procedure:-
 - → 3,2,1 minutes and 30 seconds before the start, then a final announcement that the start is given within the next 15 seconds.
- → Start lights will be used if available, either wise a whistle or a starting gun will be used to give the start.
- → The start briefing is given in the English language (one of the official languages of UCI)

DHI:

- → A downhill seeding run will take place as per the schedule given in the program.
- → All riders are required to ride in the qualification round.
- → 80% of the riders from the qualification round shall ride in the final round as per their ranking in the qualification round.

11. Technical assistance (XCO, XCR)

- a. No rider may turn back on the course to reach a feed/ technical assistance zone. Any rider doing so is disqualified. Only within the feed/ technical zone itself, a rider may turn back as long as they do not obstruct other competitors.
- b. Technical assistance during the race is permitted subject to the conditions below
- c. Authorized technical assistance during a race consist of repairs to or the replacement of any part of the bicycle other than the frame. Bike changes are not permitted, and the rider must cross the finish line with the same handlebar number plate that he had at the start.

- d. Technical assistance can only be given in the feed/ technical assistance zones.
- e. Spare equipment and tools for repair must be kept in these zones. Repairs and equipment changes can be carried out by the rider himself or with the help of a teammate, team mechanic or neutral technical assistance.
- f. In addition to technical assistance in feed zones, technical assistance is permitted outside these zones only between riders who are members of the same National Federation.

12. Race clothing

- a. Participating teams shall submit a sample of their National team clothing of validation to the commissaire panel of the events.
- b. The apparel of the riders of a National team must always be identical to the last sample submitted.
- c. Riders of the same National team must wear identical racing shorts during the same event, except for advertising space included in a lateral band 9 cm wide, which may differ from one rider to another. This means that National Federations must also provide their riders with National racing shorts.
- d. The team managers must therefore present the National jersey and shorts to the commissaire panel at the time of riders confirmation.
- e. Jersey: The jersey shall be long sleeved shirt whose sleeves extend down to the rider's wrists. Jerseys used in downhill events should be a type of specifically designed and sold for use in BMX racing or Mountain Bike Downhill events. Jerseys designed for road cycling, skinsuits, or one-piece suits comprising the jersey and the pants/ shorts are not permitted for use in downhill events. The jerseys must be either close fitting around the waist or must be tucked into the pants before the start to not cause interference.
- f. Pants: Long pants or short pants combined with suitable knee and shin protection are authorized. Such long or short pants should be of a type that is specifically designed and sold for use BMX racing or mountain bike downhill events. Long pants of the type described above must be one piece construction and made of tear-resistant material. They should cover the entire length of both legs until just above the shoe or ankle. Short pants of the type described above must be of one-piece construction and made of tear-resistant material. They should be worn together with suitable leg protection, that covers the entire knee and the entire shin until just above the ankle.
- g. A full-face helmet must be worn properly both, when racing and when training on the course. The helmet must be fitted with a peak. Open-face helmets may not be worn.
- h. The UCI strongly recommends that riders wear the following protection:
 - → Back, elbow, knee and shoulder protectors made of rigid materials,
 - → Protection for the nape and the cervical vertebrae.
 - → Padding on shins and thighs,
 - → Broad full-length trousers made from rip-resistant material incorporating protection for the knees and calves, or broad-cut shorts made from ripresistant material plus knee and calf protectors with a rigid surface,
 - → Long sleeved shirt
 - → Full finger gloves.

13. Official Ceremonies:

The following points apply to the official ceremonies:

- → Within 10 minutes following the end of each specialty (unless otherwise provided and duly recorded in an official communique), the continental champion of the event, as well as the second and third placed riders shall be ready for the official ceremony that shall be conducted under the responsibility of the President of the Commissaire panel.
- → Riders shall appear in racing attire, wearing their National jerseys but bareheaded and without headband or glasses, until they leave the official ceremony enclosure.

Ponmudi Hill, Trivandrum, Kerala Appx. 70 Km. from the hotel

18. Accommodation & Meals:

The charges of the accommodation are USD 90 per day per person for double and USD 110 per person per day for single. Single rooms are limited so teams are to book their requirements in advance, the rooms will be booked on first come first serve basis. The charges are included airport pickup and drop (one time). All the teams are advised to deposit the boarding/ lodging charges via bank transfer before arrival or upon arrival at the time of check-in.

→ Check in time: 12:00 Hrs.→ Check out time: 12:00 Hrs.

Cancellation: Free cancellation will be allowed till 19th Oct. 2023 or 6 days before the check-in date, after that 100% accommodation charges shall be borne by the respective team

Bike storage: Bicycle storage space will be provided near the race venue and it will be safe in lock and key. All the teams have to handover bicycle boxes to our representative at the Airport, which will be transported to the venue. No bicycle will be allowed to store in the hotel.

19. Transportation:

Teams will be provided free transportation from the airport to the designated hotel. Only one pick up and drop will be provided to each team, any teams requiring additional transport facility to airport and back will be charged extra. All teams must intimate their arrival 10 days in advance to arrange their pickup from airport. The Airport to Hotel is appx. 15 Km. Each team will be provided a Liaison Officer.

Nearest international airport Thiruvananthapuram (TRV) and connectivity through Delhi, Mumbai, Chennai and Kolkotta

Shuttle service from hotel to the venue and back will be provided.

Note:

- 1. Teams comprising of 17 members, and above will get dedicated shuttle for the competition days, however, small teams shall be provided shuttle along with fellow teams.
- 2. Lunch will be provided at the venue only (no lunch will be in the hotel).
- 3. Shuttle timings are as follows:
 - a. Hotel to Venue:06:30 AM
 - b. Venue to Hotel: After completion of the event
- 4. No frequent shuttle shall be provided


